



FALL FELLOWSHIP

The Fall Fellowship and Ordeal of the Bob White Lodge, Order of the Arrow, will be held November 15, 16, and 17th at Camp Linwood Hayne. Check in time will be from 6:00 - 7:30 P.M., Friday and you may check out after the conclusion of the Ordeal ceremony about 10:00 P.M., Saturday, or you may stay over until Sunday morning.

A business meeting and cracker barrel will be held Friday night with Lodge Chief Don Karolyi presiding. Among other things to be discussed is the adoption of a lodge neckerchief.

The dance team will be working on costumes and will decide upon a dance for next year's area Fellowship competition in Charleston. Every person attending must check in with the lodge secretary, Mike Harris, and every member should check with Mike to make sure that their Order of the Arrow record slip is correct and that their dues for 63-64 have been paid.

Lodge supplies will be sold and the lodge treasurer, Tommy Howard, will straighten out any discrepancies.

A new policy has been adopted by our lodge. It will now be necessary for all members attending any ceremonies to wear an indian costume. With your "Whistling Arrow" is an instruction sheet for making a breech clout. Minimum costume will be breech clout and one feather and headband.

BROTHERHOOD MEMBERSHIP

Any lodge member who has been active in the Order of the Arrow for ten months or more is eligible for Brotherhood membership. The Brotherhood ceremonies will be held on Friday night of the Fellowship, so it will be necessary that any candidate for Brotherhood be fully prepared at that time. During this Fall Ordeal all brothers and candidates must dress in Indian costume before being admitted into the Lodge circle. Elaborate costuming is not important. All you need is a simple, easy to make costume - a breech clout and moccasins. Your head ornament will be made at camp on Saturday morning.

MATERIALS:

For breech clout, use cloth in any color that suits you -- dark red, dark blue, black, or whatever.

PROCEDURE:

To get the correct size for the breech clout, measure yourself. The width should be 1/3 your waist measure; the length, your measurement from the top of your shoulders to your toes. Cut out material in one of the shapes shown in the illustration. Hem - or bind with tape along the edges. Decorate with beadwork or a simple design stenciled in oil paint.
